

ENDO VASCULAR ACCESS MEETING

24-25 JUNE 22 PATRAS, GREECE he 2nd EVA (Endo Vascular Access) Meeting is a multidisciplinary meeting focusing on the endovascular management of vascular access. It is a 2-day meeting taking place in Patras University Campus in Greece on June 24-25, 2022. Meeting's faculty is a multidisciplinary one including nephrologists, interventional nephrologists, vascular surgeons, and interventional radiologists and a multi-national one with speakers from Europe the United States, Middle East, and Asia-Paci ic regions. Its aim is to bring doctors with an interest in vascular access management together, discuss the latest updates, innovations and unmet needs in this interesting and demanding ield.

The meeting will include 19 sessions and 3 live cases from the Interventional Radiology Department of Patras University Hospital. The sessions will include the latest data on trial updates, endoAVF management, guidelines update, a session dedicated to cephalic arch, an out-of-the-box session, innovation on ESKD, vascular access imaging and central venous catheters. Additionally, the program will include two controversy sessions on paclitaxel-coated balloons and on devices used for stenosis treatment.

Meeting directors will have an "Amazing Interventions" contest for junior doctors performing endovascular procedures in vascular access. The best 5 most interesting cases will get a free registration to the meeting together with all the expenses needed for traveling and accommodation covered.

EVA Meeting welcomes this year a collaboration with 3 other major congresses. The CiDA (Controversies in Dialysis Access) congress from the United States, the DASy (Dialysis Access synergy) congress by the SoDAS (Society of Dialysis Access Specialists) from the Asia-Pacific region and the PAIRS (Pan-Arabic Interventional Radiology Society) congress from the Middle East. There will be three 45-minute "@EVA" sessions dedicated to these congresses.

EMERGENCY CONTACT

Inbound component - 112 is the European emergency number, available everywhere in the EU, free of charge

Citizens in the EU need to remember only this emergency number to reach any emergency service. 112 is particularly useful for anyone who may find themselves in distress and in need of emergency assistance while traveling in the EU.

112 is available in all EU member states alongside national emergency numbers. However, some EU countries have opted for 112 as their single emergency number. 112 is also used in some countries outside the EU —such as Switzerland and South Africa — and is available worldwide on GSM mobile networks.

In Greece, 112 is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and can connect the caller with:

- Police
- Fire Brigade
- Emergency Medical Services
- Coast Guard
- the European hotline for missing children 116000 and
- the National Helpline for children SOS 1056

When a person dials 112, specially trained operators immediately answer the call. The operators speak Greek, English and French. Depending on the emergency reported by the caller, the operator dispatches the call to the appropriate emergency service.

112 operators cannot provide traffic or weather reports, road assistance or any other type of general information. Calls to 112 can be made from landline telephones, public payphones and mobile phones (even without a SIM card), always free of charge.

112 works inside the range of any cellular network. If the area of the incident is not covered by the caller's network, the 112 call will be routed through other cellular networks which cover the area (national and international roaming).

112 calls provide the caller location capability. You may also reach 112 via the following alternative channels:

- Text message (SMS) or MMS to 112.
- Fax to 11.112.
- Email at contact@112.gov.gr.

When dialing 112, the emergency call taker will ask for the location of the emergency and questions to determine whether you need police, fire, medical or other assistance. When reaching 112 by text message, fax or email, include the following information on your message:

What is your emergency? - What is the location of the emergency? - Are there any casualties?
